Approval of Minutes:

President McConnell announced that the minutes of the regular meeting held on December 11, 2008 had been mailed to all the trustees and called for any additions or corrections. James Wright noted that he was shown in attendance but that Gary Crane

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(A) was actually in attendance. It was moved by John Piwinski, with a second by Tom Lahetta to approve the minutes as corrected. All voted yea. Motion carried.

Old Business:

It was reported to the Board that the PUBLIC NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 PERMIT APPLICATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARING had been advertised on December 30, 2009. The public information and Public Hearing relative to issues of lower water quality is scheduled for February 18, 2009 at the Carlisle Township Building East, 1959 Grafton Road, as printed in the PUBLIC NOTICE. A time line of events detailing the reviews to the final 401 Water Quality permit was also presented.

New Business:

President McConnell called for suggestions to set dates and times for regular LORCO monthly meetings in 2009. Following discussion, it was moved by John Piwinski, with a second by Doug Edwards to designate the second Thursday of the month at 7:00 p.m. as the date and time for LORCO regular monthly meetings. It was also noted that an alternate time in conjunction with Eastern Daylight Savings Time could be considered later. All voted Yea. Motion carried.

 That in anticipation of receiving permanent construction funding with a financing guarantee from the USDA/ Rural Development, the LORCO Rural Wastewater District may be required to expend or incur cost for planning and/or fees for the purpose of making capital improvements to their wastewater collection facility, which costs expended or incurred will be considered a part of the total USDA/Rural Development construction loan and the LORCO Rural Wastewater District may claim such costs as reimbursable expenses through the loan.

The board received comment from the public attending the meeting. Among issues of storm water retention and drainage, road elevation, estimated developments and cost numbers, it was recognized that the LORCO effort to obtain job ready infrastructure project stimulus money from the federal government could be enhanced by support from the citizens of Eaton Township. Bill Hemmer of Cooley Road indicated that he would help the effort to obtain stimulus money by circulating a petition. LORCO staff was then directed to draft language conducive to a petition supporting the Carlisle-Eaton Wastewater Project need for federal stimulus assistance.
