EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Most will not be thinking about sewers. That's okay. The LORCO Board of Trustees and I will be concerned about these issues.

This past summer involved some very promising and interesting developments concerning wastewater treatment for Lorain County. A serious effort was made to actually study the merits and develop a working model of how to build a regional treatment system for wastewater treatment in Lorain County. There is much left to be done on this project but the fact that it has been started is very encouraging.

The next step in the study of regional wastewater treatment is to present the model and the economics to the individual communities who might be interested in participating. As many of you know, LORCO has been a regional advocate for years. Unfortunately, not everyone in the county agrees regional projects are beneficial. The challenge will be to first have a good plan with well developed numbers and projections. The second challenge will be to demonstrate the savings advantages for communities to participate. We all hope this will work out for improved availability and efficiencies in wastewater treatment for Lorain County.

LORCO has a very strong interest in the development of a regional wastewater

treatment plan. Currently we must negotiate rates with other communities for treatment. The alternative would be to build our own treatment center which has not been cost effective. Participating in regional treatment will allow LORCO to be a member of a treatment center. By being a participating member our rates will be for treatment only as we develop new systems. advantage is the ability to provide service to unsewered areas of the county at lower costs. The biggest challenge we have faced in developing new sewer projects has been finding a treatment center to convey wastewater efficiently. Initial studies show the regional plan will solve this issue for a good part of the LORCO district.

I will try to keep everyone informed in the coming months as this process progresses.
