- 3. Attended 4/11/24 Lorain County Wastewater Regionalization meeting at county administrative offices in Elyria. Making significant progress in discussing proposed 6119 financing and governance. Meeting with Rob Munro, ALRW on Monday (4/15) at 1 pm.
- 4. Received inquiry from Environmental Design Group regarding LORCO infrastructure in the vicinity of Claremar Twin Lakes, Huntington Township. Cinnamon Lake collection system is approximately 8.5 miles away (to the southeast).
- 5. Attended 4/9/24 online Ohio Auditor of State public records and Ohio Sunshine Law training.
- 6. Posted LORCO Public Records Policy and Records Retention Schedule in LORCO conference room.
- 7. Update on FPA change request for a single, 5-acre parcel on Castleton Lane. Request was filed 1/18/24. The parcel is currently in the Elyria FPA but the city does not have sewers nearby. Recommended for approval 3/15/24 NOACA Water Quality Subcommittee; on

Planning & Programming Committee 4/12/24 agenda (tomorrow); recommended to the Executive Committee (5/10/24) for placement on the Board's agenda on 6/7/24 = adoption via resolution = officially modified.

- 8. Huntington Bank "Reverse Positive Pay" and "ACH Positive Pay" is up and running. Both are programs offered by Huntington to help prevent paper check and ACH transaction fraud.
- 9. Received lien check in the amount of \$11,671.63 from Ashland County auditor (liens filed in September 2023 for unpaid Cinnamon Lake bills).

Report given by Neil Lynch, committee chair. Policy Committee met at 6 pm prior to tonight's board meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss a proposal to apply a portion of customer tap fee payments to the cost of line extensions where it is necessary to extend existing LORCO lines in order to be able to serve new customers.
